# Got it nailed: Hardware store a Father's Day success story

## 3 generations and a dog make it a True family affair

Gary McKay pauses and reflects on the past 46 years—time that has spanned far more than dining-room light dimmers. Best of all, it's given him time to get enjoyment out of being a father.

"We're never going to be the Rockefellers or anything," McKay said, "but it's a good living for us."

"And what makes it great is we get to do it as a family." Last June, Gary, who also has been a traveling hardware wholesaler, owner of a landscaping business and a volunteer firefighter, bought and re-opened a hardware store on the southeastern corner of Ray and Rural roads, now McKay's True Value.

"It's natural to do this," McKay said. "It's in our blood. I've tried to go away from the business but I keep getting sucked right back into it. I figured I might as well stay."

Shortly after Gary opened his store in Chandler, he convinced his youngest son, Noah, 23, who was managing a pizza shop, to join him.

"We're now three-generation, hardware-store people," Gary said. "My brother and I followed our father into the business, and now both of my sons are in it, too."

That makes this Father's Day particularly special for Gary.

"It means a lot that boys have chosen to follow in my footsteps, which my father started," Gary said. "We are a family working together. It feels good. It's fun teaching him all the things I know. He has so many things to learn."

Gary's father and grandmother had sold their machine shop in Michigan in the 1970s. They were considering a

hardware store or a motel as their next business.

"Dad put it to a vote of us kids, and we told him we didn't want to be changing bed sheets the rest of our lives," McKay said with a smile. "So I've been doing hardware for 46 years."

McKay, who grew up working in his father's store in South Haven, Mich., found his way to the Valley in 2002. His brother, Barry, already was here and the owner of two hardware stores himself in north-central Phoenix. Gary's oldest son, Logan, 28, works in one of Barry's stores, hoping one day to buy it.

Gary and his wife, Susan, live in Ahwatukee. She was running her business, Foothills Remodel and Design, which specializes in bathrooms and kitchens, from their home. She now has space in the hardware store, which stocks more than the norm in floor covering as a result. Like Noah, she also is learning the hardware-store business. Gary also employs three part timers.

Noah typically reports for work accompanied by his dog, Tucson, who roams the premises and interacts with customers, especially younger ones.

"It takes long hours to ensure success," Noah said. "It's especially hard on him, being the owner of the business. This is his retirement. He doesn't want to sit at home or go play golf. He likes helping people. Most of our customers are because of his knowledge."

"It's actually really cool to be able to work with my dad every day, and obviously bring my dog in to work every day."

Corona research hopeful gets a buzz from global science entry

What led to Angela Ding's brainy decision to enter one of the world's top science and engineering competitions? You might say it was just a random bee in her bonnet.

As a result, the Corona del Sol High School student is aimed in the right direction to achieve her goal of becoming a medical researcher.

Angela, who will enter her senior year in the fall, was named a finalist by the International Society for Technology in Education for her project to evaluate the brains of bees.

The award was given at this year's Intel International Science and Engineering Fair, the world's largest science research competition attracting high school students from all around the U.S.

After it was over, Angela said the event was more like a convention than a competition. She chose to become involved because it seemed like such a good learning opportunity, not because she expected to win an award.

In the face of such stiff competition, event planners said it's impressive for any student to be chosen for recognition and earn a ribbon and a \$1,000 cash prize.

"It was a wonderful learning experience for me and opened my eyes to many of the possibilities for the future in science," said Angela. "I also was impressed that the scientific community is so welcoming to students.

"It was a chance to meet geniuses," said Angela during a telephone interview, "and to talk with other students whose ideas for science projects were truly impressive and

innovative."

Some of the ideas deemed most worthy by Angela include a device, worn on the wrist, to control the tremors of Parkinson's disease. Another involves a method that requires only a small drop of blood for medical tests instead of many vials.


The Intel International Science and Engineering Fair honors the world's most promising student scientists, inventors and engineers. Finalists are selected annually from hundreds of affiliated fairs. Then, their projects are evaluated onsite by approximately 1,000 judges from nearly every scientific discipline, each with a Ph.D. or the equivalent of six years of related professional experience in one of the scientific disciplines.

Angela says she is aiming for a career in medical research, much like her father, a materials engineer at Medtronic, a bio-medical device company. And, it's not only his career choice that is an inspiration; so is his encouragement.

"My dad always fostered my love of science and he challenges me to consider questions or problems that need solving to help build my critical-thinking skills. He also encouraged my older sister, who choose a career in the STEM field and is an engineer," said Angela. She is a native of Phoenix who grew up in Tempe. She says she enjoys attending Corona because it offers Advanced Placement programs and have great teachers.

"My AP teachers are very encouraging and work hard to provide a learning environment to grow in," said Angela.

Though it may be hard to imagine that bees possess a brain large enough

to study, they actually are highly evolved, according to many scientists, including Dr. Hong Lei from ASU, associate professor of research in the School of Life Sciences. Lei is actively involved in bee research and agreed to serve as Angela's s mentor.

Said Lei:  
"The program director, Dr. Nate Newman, sent me Angela's information

along with another student. I accepted both of them, and it turned out to be the smartest decision. She is a wonderful student.

"I was very impressed by their progress, particularly when they decided to spend their entire spring break doing experiments. Obviously, all their hard work paid off in the end. I am very proud of them."

## Longtime Chandler attorney named presiding magistrate

David Fuller has been appointed presiding city magistrate of Chandler Municipal Court, succeeding Michael Traynor, who will retire June 21 after serving in the post for the past 34 years. Fuller's appointment was effective June 3.

Fuller comes to Chandler from the city of Phoenix, where he had served as assistant director of the Public Defender's Office since 2014.

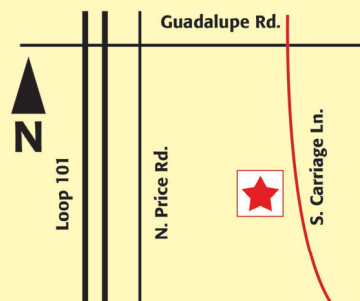

## For 18 families, the dream of homeownership comes true

### *Additional 16 homes on the way thanks to Tempe and Habitat for Humanity*

**E**ighteen families have a new place to call home with completion of the unique Tempe Parkview Townhome community, a partnership between the city of Tempe and Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona designed to increase affordable housing options in the city.

On the heels of that successful development, Tempe and Habitat are set to collaborate on another 16 homes in the city, building on a partnership that stretches more than three decades. Construction on the first homes is expected to begin in September.

"The Mayor and City Council, along with our residents and our entire community, are committed to expanding affordable and workforce housing across our city," said Vice Mayor Lauren Kuby. "We will look to every tool in the toolbox using Affordable Housing Impact Statements, an Affordable Housing Trust Fund, and incentivizing developers to build out this vision for quality housing and healthy communities."

#### Unique community

The Tempe Parkview Townhome community, at 1937 E. Don Carlos Ave., is the first of its kind for the nonprofit Habitat for Humanity.

The city of Tempe purchased the property near McClintock and

University drives using federal Community Development Block Grant funds to create more affordable housing. The city later partnered with Habitat to create a new kind of community that maximized the one-acre lot with modern three-story townhomes.

The community came together through the work of roughly 7,400 volunteers and the sweat equity of the 18 families purchasing the townhomes. It is the embodiment of Habitat's mission to bring together people to build homes, communities and hope.

"For these home buyers this is a beginning. This is about their future," said Jason Barlow, president and chief executive officer of Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona. "Think about the homework that will be done in these homes. Think about home-cooked meals that will be served in these homes. The lives changed because of a place called home."

"At Habitat, we firmly believe nothing activates a space better than three bedrooms and two baths," Barlow said.

#### Journey to homeownership

The Parkview community is as unique as it is diverse, with families from as near as Mesa and far away as Iraq and Venezuela. There are moms, dads and kids of all ages. The residents are all on different paths: students,

managers, drivers, caregivers, office workers, stay-at-home moms. The common thread is homeownership and hope for a better future.

For new resident Mohamed Mohamed, homeownership would have been out of reach in his native Sudan. Now a citizen here, the 29-year-old who works in the private security field is thrilled to be out of his studio apartment and into a home where he can build a new life and prepare for a family when the time comes.

“Life (in Sudan) is way harder and tougher. Not many people can imagine a home there. But having a home is a blessed experience,” he said. “This is a dream for all of us to see the homes and neighborhood finally finished.”

#### Hope for the future

Over the next couple of years, more families will become homebuyers as the city and Habitat move ahead

with 16 new homes. They will be built on four lots purchased by the city with CDBG funds for affordable housing, near Roosevelt Street and Southern Avenue, Victory Drive and Evergreen Road, Don Carlos Avenue and McClintock Drive, and 19th and McKemy streets.

Tempe is focused on providing a range of affordable housing options through government programs and partnerships with private developers and nonprofit organizations like Habitat.

“Habitat for Humanity Central Arizona is the ideal city partner,” Kuby said.

“Their mission is to realize the dream of home ownership for our families, to harness volunteers and local businesses to craft energy-efficient homes and build close-knit communities.”



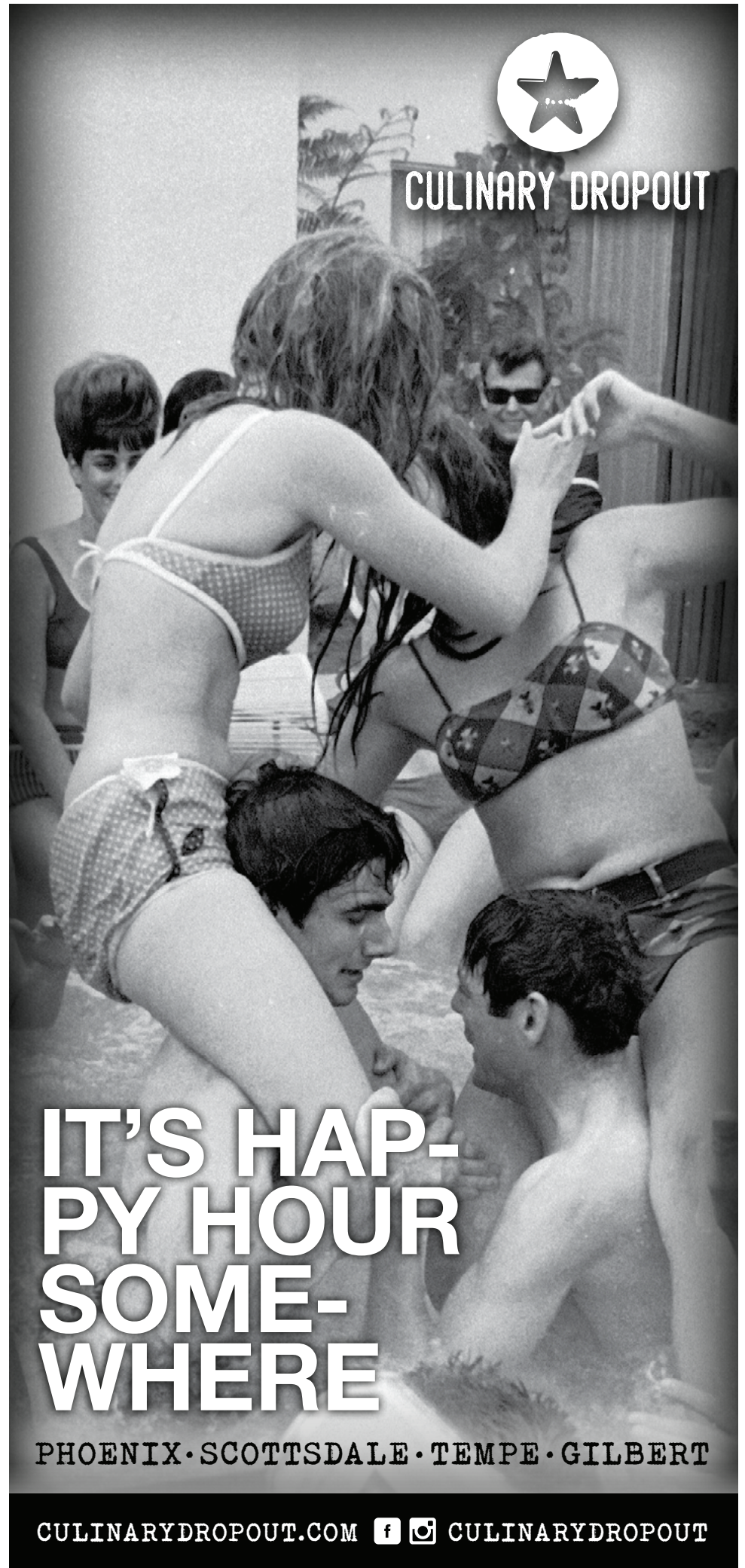

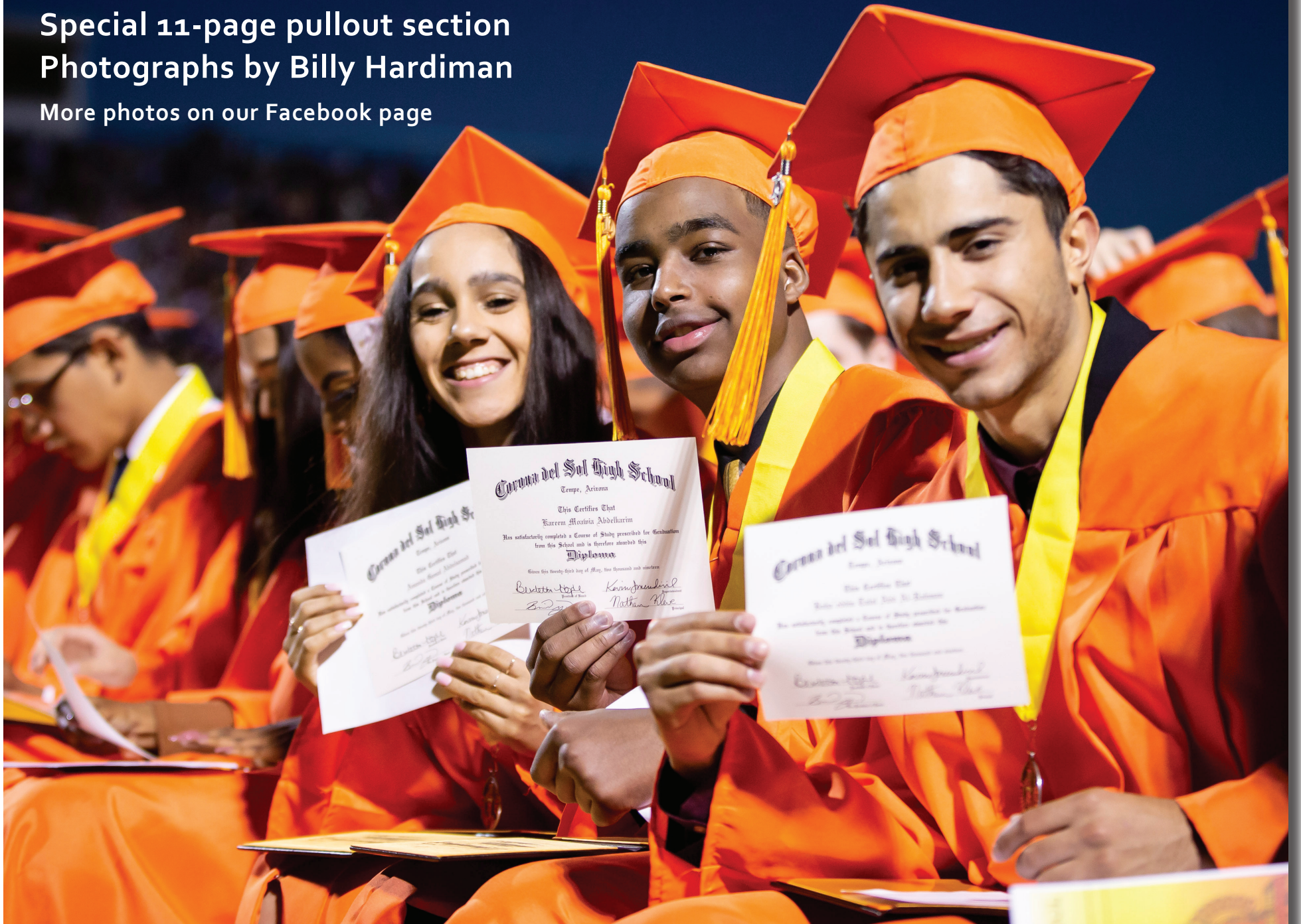

“I want children to know that, even when they leave Cielo, we think about them—we care about them and we are excited for their milestones,” said Castillo.

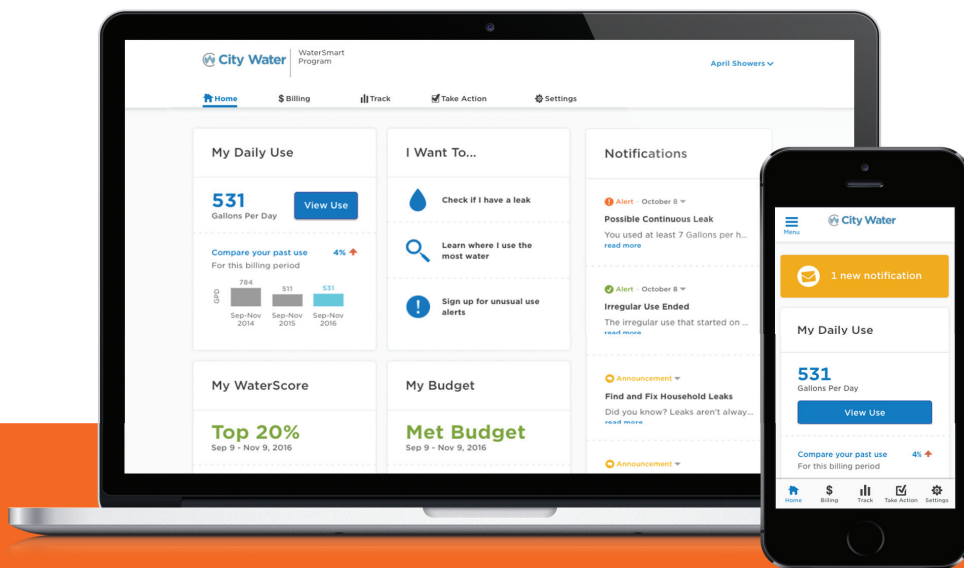
“We are so happy to be able to celebrate their high school graduation with them and wish them well in their future endeavors.”

## STATE TRACK AND FIELD MEET RESULTS Corona, Marcos, McClintock take honors

Several athletes from local Tempe high schools competed at the state AIA track and field championships last month in three different divisions.

Corona del Sol had 15 athletes qualify and compete in the Men's Division I State Track and Field Meet May 1, 3 and 4 at Mesa Community College in individual track and field events as well as part of three relay

teams.

The Aztecs, as a team, finished in 12th place out of 23 D1 teams with a total of 19 points.

In the individual running events, junior **Jean Boyd** was the top finisher for Corona taking sixth place in the 100 meters with a time of 10.90.

Boyd also qualified to compete in the 200 meters where he crossed the finish line in seventh place with a time

of 22.34.

Boyd ran his third race at the state meet as part of Corona's 4x100 relay team where he ran the second leg, behind **Joshua Holt**, the lead-off runner.

**Jack Farley** ran the third leg and **Devon McGee** the final leg to help the Aztecs take eighth place in the 4x100 relay finals.

**Richard Pearsall** helped the Aztecs qualify to run in the finals when he ran the final leg of the relay for McGee in the 4x100 preliminaries.

Freshman **Bennett Gunning** was the second leading finisher in the running events for the Aztecs when he crossed the finish line in seventh place in the 800 meters setting a personal record with a time of 1:57.75.

Senior **David Keeney** finished in 17th place while freshman **James Van Wicklin** set a personal best record of 52:00 to finish 18th in the 400 meters.

Junior **Zachary Johnson** also set a personal record when he ran the 1600 meters in 4:30.54 finishing in 12th place. Johnson, Corona's only long-distance runner to qualify to run at state this year, finished 22nd in the 3200 meters.

Gunning and Johnson were also part of Corona's 4x800 relay team of senior **Joel Wadsworth**, Van Wicklin, Gunning and Johnson that finished fourth, with a time of 8:00.57, behind the 4x800 relay teams from Highland, Mountain View and Brophy.

Corona's 4x400 relay team of Keeney, Van Wicklin, Wadsworth and Gunning also qualified to run in the D1 state tournament where they finished 11th in the preliminaries and did not qualify to run in the finals.

In the men's field events, senior **Tanner Kippes** was Corona's top finisher with a fifth-place finish in the pole vault crossing the bar at 14-09.00 and scoring four points for the Aztec's team score.

Junior **Tyson McLain** was Corona's next top field event finisher taking seventh place in the high jump event clearing 6-00.00

Junior **Issam Zerek** placed 10th in the triple jump event with a jump of 41-04.00 while senior **Wyatt Hackenyos** took 14th place in the pole vault and senior **Michael Hall** was 24th in the discus throw event.

Corona's girls team had 14 athletes qualify and compete at the DI state track meet held at Mesa Community College May 1, 3 and 4.

The top finisher for the girls team was senior **Brennan Agnew** who set a personal record with a shot-put throw of 38-09.00 to take fourth place.

Agnew continued to impress in the field events with a 112-04 javelin throw

to earn a seventh-place finish.

Senior **Haley Johnson** also qualified for and threw the javelin at the Division I state meet where she took 22nd place.

Corona's senior pole vaulter, **Jolynn Fleming** took 10th place with a vault of 10-00.00 while fellow senior **Christina Fleming** took 16th place in the pole vault.

In the triple jump event, junior **Suzie Marshall** jumped 32-07.00 to take 18th place while senior **Lauryn White** was 20th out of 23 competitors in the finals.

White, who also qualified for state in the high jump event, cleared 4-10.00 to take 15th place out of 24 jumpers while junior **Payton Deer** set a personal record in the long jump event by jumping 17-03.50 to take 17th place.

In the running events, senior **Meg Horvath** took seventh place in the 100-meter finals with a time of 12.60.

Both Horvath and junior **Anisa McLain** set personal records in the 200 meters prelims but did not qualify to run in the finals.

Corona's girls team qualified three relay teams to run at the state meet.

Corona's 4x100 relay team of Johnson, Horvath, White and McLain came in 12th place while the 4x400 relay team of **Ashlinn Aguayo**, **Audrey Weidner**, McLain and **Zoey Allen** took 13th place.

Also qualifying to run at state was Corona's 4x800 relay team of Aguayo, Weidner, sophomore **Annessa Rodriguez-Davis** and **Zoe Johnson**.

### McClintock Track and Field Division II State Meet Results

McClintock had 14 athletes competed at the Division II State Track Meet where their men's 4x100 relay team of **Jeremy Huckaby**, **Jack White**, **William Roberts** and **Prince Conteh** ran an amazing 42.28 to take first place in the preliminaries but came up just a bit short in the finals taking third place behind Casteel and Millennium with a time of 42.50.

Junior Huckaby also qualified to run in the 100 meters and 200 meters where he took eighth place in both events with a time of 11.09 in the 100

He'd called on the previous owner while in the wholesale business. He'd done a demographic report. He knew the area was affluent with a good mix of do-it-yourselfers and those who need guidance with home projects.

He beefed up the grilling and outdoor department and the fastener department and the made-to-order screen department for them.

The response has been overwhelming and favorable, Gary said.

"We wanted to do a few things over the top," he said.

He plans to expand to lawnmower and chainsaw repair and then to tool rental.

He loves working with customers, gratified by stories like the elderly lady who'd lost her husband. She brought in cookies and brownies after he told her how to fix a leaky toilet, and she went home and did it herself.

"I enjoy those kind of rewards," he said. "It's enjoyable. I don't consider that I'm working. I consider that I'm retired and get to help people.

"My brother and I always told my boys what my dad told us:

This is going to be one job where you're going to get paid to get educated in. You're going to take away from this more than you ever give to it, because you'll learn things you're going use the rest of your life."

system for contaminants.

A legal notice about the quality of drinking water was recently sent to water customers who live in West Chandler after routine testing revealed the city's water system exceeded a drinking water maximum contaminant level standard. The city's water quality division regularly monitors for the presence of over 90 drinking water contaminants regulated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency under the Safe Drinking Water Act.

Testing from a West Chandler site between July 2018 and April 2019 showed an average total trihalomethanes of 85 parts per billion. The site is located near the intersection of Chandler Boulevard and 54th Street. The city's 11 other TTHM sampling sites remain below the MCL.

The notice sent by the city states: "this is not an emergency. If it had been an emergency, you would have been notified within 24 hours." Still, it advises residents that those who have a "severely compromised immune system, have an infant, are pregnant, or are elderly" may be at increased risk and should seek advice from their health care providers about drinking this water during the interim time period while the city is resolving the issue.

Chandler is encouraging residents to share the information about its drinking water issue with those who may not have received the official notice, such as businesses, schools and those living in

apartments and nursing homes.

The executive director of a nursing home located near the West Chandler testing site did not want to comment on the situation but said the facility filters all its drinking water. According to the city's notice, reverse osmosis systems and pitchers or taps with carbon filters can reduce or eliminate the total trihalomethanes.

People who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience problems with their liver, kidneys, or central nervous system, and may have

an increased risk of getting cancer.

The city's notice states customers can safely continue normal use of Chandler's drinking water and that boiling or other corrective actions are not necessary.

Chris Connor, Utility Regulatory Affairs manager for Chandler, said the city's public works and utilities staff work around the clock to ensure Chandler has a safe drinking water supply, with extensive testing performed every day to ensure that it meets the health and safety standards set by the state and federal government.

"When we were notified of the violation, we responded quickly and made process adjustments that resulted in the contaminant level rapidly dropping to well below the required threshold," Connor said.

"While we were required to notify some residents about this elevated level of TTHMs, this exposure was limited and did not pose an immediate health risk. It was not an emergency and Chandler water is safe to drink."

The city has already made adjustments to the treatment process and non-compliance sample results verify that the TTHMs are currently well below the Maximum Contaminant Level or MCL.

The city will take the next compliance samples in early July, based on the compliance schedule. Because the MCL is calculated based on an average, July will be the earliest it can achieve being below the MCL under the EPA rule.

## Restaurant entrepreneur performs Voodoo magic — one more time

**V**ooDoo Daddy's is back—or maybe it would be more accurate to say it's here for the first time, and potentially better than ever.

Confused? No need to be. Tempe and Chandler foodies may remember a purveyor of Cajun and creole specialties called Voodoo Daddy's Magic Kitchen and Bar at Warner and McClintock in Tempe. Ron Lynch certainly does.

"It closed about 13 years ago," says Lynch. "I was a regular customer of that one."

The Oklahoma native and University of Oklahoma graduate is a longtime veteran of the restaurant business. In the early 2000s, Lynch was in charge of the Schlotzsky's Deli chain here in the Valley. But when it came time for him to go to lunch himself, he often looked elsewhere.

"My dad was a fan of red beans and rice, so he'd come around and we'd go together to lunch at Voodoo Daddy's,"



Lynch recalls. "I always liked the name."

So Lynch, who was also president of the Tilted Kilt chain and headed the venerable Tempe Diablos community-service organization, paid tribute to his old favorite in the name of his latest project, VooDoo Daddy's Steam Kitchen.

The new place, describing itself as featuring fast-casual Cajun, creole and Caribbean, opened in mid-May in the

Costco Plaza on Elliot, between Priest and Hardy in Tempe.

As such, Lynch's new place carries on the tradition of offering enticing Louisiana-style cooking, but with a few twists. The major development is right there in the new name: Steam.

"What makes us a little different," explains Lynch, "is that we use steam kettles. That allows us to make each order for each individual customer, and still make it fast."

Lynch knows that many diners—like me—enjoy the flavors of Cajun and similar dishes, but often find the spice level a little hard on our guts.

"A lot of people shy away from Cajun and creole because it has that reputation," he admits. He believes they will find the new VooDoo Daddy's take on the cuisine more agreeable.

Lynch also hopes that, along with the gumbo and jambalaya, etouffee, po'boys and shrimp and grits—and, of

course, his father's favorite red beans and rice—visitors will be drawn in by the elegant New Orleans inspired atmosphere.

The brightly colored, festive 3,150-square-foot space features murals depicting the New Orleans jazz scene as well as a patio for outdoor dining.

Asked if he sees VooDoo Daddy's Steam Kitchen as yet another candidate for eventual chain restaurant status, Lynch isn't coy.

"I hope to expand it," he says, "like I did with Schlotzsky's and Tilted Kilt. It's kind of what I do. But for now, one restaurant is enough."

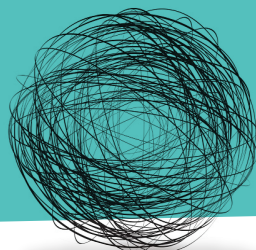

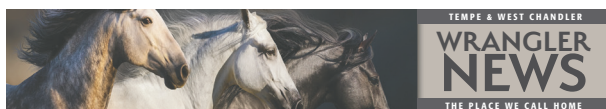

## Tempe Runs on Water – Use It Wisely

Commentary by Mark Mitchell, Mayor of Tempe

Since our founding, the City of Tempe's existence has depended on water. In the 1860s, Charles Hayden stumbled upon a bend in the Salt River and began a new community he called Hayden's Ferry.

The story of water in the desert is the story of human ingenuity, sacrifice and long-term deliberate and strategic planning. In our community, this story has been retold for generations.

From the prehistoric Hohokam engineers who hand-dug a network of canals diverting water from the Salt River to the enterprising farmers who pledged their land as collateral to get funding from the federal government to construct Roosevelt Dam, early settlers to Tempe knew that life in the Sonoran Desert depends on wise water management.

Founder Charles Hayden's son, Carl Hayden, served as a U.S. Senator and was pivotal in the building of the Roosevelt Dam and the authorization of the Central Arizona Project (CAP).

Senator Hayden was born and raised in Tempe and served as a Tempe City Council member in the early 1900s. Clearly, his roots in Hayden's Ferry made him aware of how precious water is in a land prone to long periods of drought.

Today, we're continuing the

legacy of wise water management and building upon it through water conservation programs that help educate and enable residents to use water wisely, efficiently and consciously.

Since 2006, Tempe's residential water use has fallen by 15 percent even though our population as grown. Why?

Our residents are committed to water conservation by upgrading to efficient plumbing fixtures, choosing water-wise plants and watering all landscape types efficiently.

We can't stop there.

The challenges posed by climate change will impact the quantity and quality of water available in our region, affecting where and when water appears, as well as the intensity with which it is delivered. These impacts are already here, affecting all Americans. Historic tree ring studies have shown our desert region is already susceptible to mega-droughts that have lasted 20 to 30 years. The impacts we are seeing today may exacerbate the effects of these drought patterns.

We're currently in the worst 23-year drought in the last 700 years, and as a responsible community, Tempe must continue to lead in wise water management in collaboration with regional partners, as well as at home.

This summer, Tempe's Water Conservation Program will embark on a High Intensity Action Plan, including a 100-Day Water Efficiency Challenge. During this time, we're

going to engage with Tempe's largest-volume residential customers. Conservation staff will be offering free water efficiency consultations, up to \$500 towards upgrading sprinkler components or irrigation controllers, and access and guidance to the city's new WaterSmart Online Water Use Portal, which connects residents to their hourly water usage and unusual water usage (leak) detection and high bill alerts.

The goal of this 100-day Water Efficiency Challenge is to engage our residents to reduce water consumption in painless yet effective ways.

By registering with the new WaterSmart Portal, residents will have a tool to manage their water usage as well as provide one-on-one water consultations that will arm them with the information they need to use water efficiently while maintaining the landscapes and activities they love.

As your Mayor, I encourage you to visit [tempe.gov/conservation](http://tempe.gov/conservation) and look for programs, information and rebates that can help you learn how to live more sustainably (while also saving on your utility bill) and to contact our Water Conservation Team for a consultation.

Residents of Tempe have historically made wise choices and investments. It is my hope that, together, we can continue that legacy so that the next generation can prosper.

The City of Tempe is pleased to provide our customers with Tempe's annual Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for calendar year 2018. This report contains information regarding the quality of drinking water provided by the City of Tempe. Included is a listing of results from required water quality tests, as well as an explanation of where our water comes from and tips on how to interpret the data. The City of Tempe is committed to delivering safe, high quality water to our customers.

**Overview**  
In 2018, the City of Tempe Water Utilities Division of the Public Works Department distributed 178 billion gallons of water to Tempe and Guadalupe customers. In addition to the testing we are required to perform, the results of which are provided in this report, our water system routinely monitors for additional substances and microscopic organisms to make certain our water is safe and of the highest quality. For more information, please contact the City of Tempe at (480) 350-4311.

**Water Sources**  
In 2018, the drinking water in Tempe was produced at two conventional surface water treatment plants and twelve groundwater wells. The Johnny G. Martinez Water Treatment Plant is located in north Tempe and the South Tempe Water Treatment Plant is located in south Tempe. The City of Tempe provides water to its customers from several sources:

**Central Arizona Project (CAP) water** - Beginning its journey from Lake Havasu, Colorado River water is delivered through the CAP canal system to central Arizona, including the Phoenix and Tucson areas. Tempe used 1.5 billion gallons (or 410 million gallons per day) of Colorado River water delivered by CAP for both potable municipal use as well as groundwater recharge and other uses. This supply made up 8.4% of the water used in Tempe in 2018. Of that, 1.5 billion gallons, 320 million gallons were recharged into to the aquifer to use during times of drought and shortage.

**Salt River Project (SRP) water** - This water is collected from the Salt and Verde River watersheds, stored in six SRP reservoirs and diverted into SRP canals at the Granite Reef Dam in Mesa. SRP also relies on groundwater wells to supplement surface water in the canal system. Tempe's allocation of SRP water depends on the amount of runoff from the watershed and the amount of water available in storage in SRP reservoirs, and therefore varies from year to year. Tempe's SRP water use for 2018 was 14.2 billion gallons (or 39 million gallons per day). This supply made up 79.8% of the water used in Tempe in 2018.

**Groundwater** - In 2018, Tempe used twelve of its groundwater wells to supplement the supplies of Central Arizona Project water and Salt River Project water. Tempe pumped 2.1 billion gallons (or 6 million gallons per day) of water from its wells, which was a combination of groundwater and surface water previously stored underground in our aquifers. This supply made up 11.8% of water used in Tempe in 2018.

**Contaminants in Drinking Water**  
To ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) prescribes regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The Food and Drug Administration regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water. Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The levels of contaminants in Tempe's finished water are largely determined by source water, which can vary from year-to-year depending on watershed conditions, reservoir storage, and the volume of groundwater pumped. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants in tap water and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800) 426-4991. Information on bottled water can be obtained from the Food and Drug Administration.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animal or human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include the following:

- (A) microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, that may be from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, or wildlife;
- (B) inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, that can be naturally-occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming;
- (C) pesticides and herbicides that may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban stormwater runoff, and residential use;
- (D) organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic compounds that are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff and septic systems; and
- (E) radioactive contaminants that can be naturally-occurring or can be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.

**Tempe Drinking Water Quality**

The following tables show regulated substances that were required to be tested and were detected in Tempe drinking water in 2018. Tempe monitored for many more substances which were not detected. The tables contain the name of each substance detected, the highest level allowed by regulation, the ideal goals for public health, the amount detected, and the usual sources of such contamination. Certain contaminants are required to be monitored less than one time per year because concentrations of these contaminants are not expected to vary significantly from year to year. For those contaminants that were not required to be tested in 2018, this report includes data from the most recent required testing. Tempe maintained compliance with all Safe Drinking Water Act Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCLs).

**Definitions and Acronyms:**  
**Action Level (AL):** The concentration of a contaminant that, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements that a public water system shall follow.  
**Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL):** The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCLs are set as close to the MCLGs as feasible using the best available treatment technology.  
**Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG):** The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLGs allow for a margin of safety.  
**Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level (MRDL):** The highest level of a disinfectant allowed in drinking water. There is a convincing evidence that addition of a disinfectant is necessary for control of microbial contaminants.  
**Maximum Residual Disinfectant Level Goal (MRDLG):** The level of a drinking water disinfectant below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MRDLGs do not reflect the benefits of the use of disinfectants to control microbial contaminants.  
**Non-Detect (ND):** Not detected in sample.  
**Not Applicable (N/A):** Does not apply.  
**Parts per billion (ppb) or micrograms per liter (µg/l):** Units used to measure the concentration of a substance found in water. One ppm is approximately equal to 1/2 gallon of water in an Olympic sized swimming pool. One µg is a thousand times less than one ppm.  
**Picocuries per liter (pCi/L):** A measure of radioactivity.  
**Running Annual Average (RAA):** The average of analytical results for samples taken during the previous four calendar quarters.  
**Local Annual Average (LAA)/RAA for a specified location.**  
**Treatment technique (TT):** A required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.  
**Variances and Exemptions:** State or EPA permission to not meet an MCL or a treatment technique under certain conditions.

**2018 Results for Unregulated Contaminant Monitoring Rule (UCMR4)**  
Tempe is committed to protecting public health and meets or surpasses all state and federal health standards for tap water. To help advance the science of drinking water, Tempe collected data on several currently unregulated contaminants. The purpose of this monitoring was to gather occurrence data to support the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in making decisions regarding whether or not to regulate contaminants in the future. These substances do not have Maximum Contaminant Levels. Instead, results are reported to the Minimum Reporting Levels (MRL). The EPA established the MRL as the lowest accurately reportable limit. In 2018, Tempe monitored its water sources and distribution system for 32 unregulated substances. The seven (7) substances in the table below were detected. Tempe will closely monitor EPA's health studies and will keep informed of any regulatory developments. Should new regulations be developed, Tempe will ensure that your drinking water continues to meet EPA requirements.

**Public Notification of Failure to Report a Detected Compound in CCR**  
The City of Tempe is required to report the occurrence and concentration of any detected regulated contaminants during the calendar year in the Consumer Confidence Report (CCR). In 2017, the City of Tempe detected Trichloroethylene at one monitoring location at concentrations well below the MCL and reported those results, as required, to ADEQ. However, the results were not reported in the 2017 CCR. Tempe has no reason to believe the missing result in the CCR had an impact on public health. Tempe has taken measures to ensure that all detected compounds are reported in future CCRs.

**Public Notification of Failure to Report on Time**  
While this is not an emergency, you, as our customers, have a right to know about the following reporting failure and what we did to correct this situation. The City of Tempe is required to report the results of the Long Term 2 Enhanced Surface Water Treatment Rule (LT2) to the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ) no later than six (6) months after the system completes monitoring. Tempe's report was due to ADEQ by September 30, 2017 but was submitted on October 3, 2017. Tempe was issued a reporting violation on April 25, 2018. The LT2 monitoring determined that Tempe is meeting rule requirements and there is no reason to believe the late reporting had an impact on public health.

**Public Notification of Failure to Report Results of Lead and Copper Monitoring on Time**  
The City of Tempe is required to notify participants in the Lead and Copper Rule monitoring program of their results within 30 days of receiving them from the laboratory. Tempe did not send notices to 18 out of 52 customers within the required time frame; however, all residents with results above the prescribed action level were notified within two (2) days of receiving official laboratory reports. Tempe has no reason to believe the late reporting of results had an impact on public health. Tempe has taken measures to improve the tracking and reporting of results to ensure the regulatory agencies receive timely and accurate reports.

**Public Notification of Failure to Report Cyanide Results on Time**  
While this is not an emergency, you, as our customers, have a right to know about the following reporting failure and what we did to correct this situation. The City of Tempe is required to report the results of all analytical data consistent with the monitoring and reporting schedules established by the Safe Drinking Water Act. The results from cyanide sampling conducted during the second quarter of 2018 (Q2/2018) were not provided during the 2018 reporting period. The City of Tempe was returned to compliance when the results from cyanide sampling were submitted to ADEQ. Cyanide was not detected in 2018. Tempe has no reason to believe the late reporting of results had an impact on public health. Tempe has taken measures to improve the tracking and reporting of results to ensure the regulatory agencies receive timely and accurate reports.

**Public Notification of Failure to Monitor and Report - Di-2-ethylhexylphthalate (DEHP)**  
While this is not an emergency, you, as our customers, have a right to know about the following event and what we did to correct this situation. Since the original detection of Di-2-ethylhexylphthalate (DEHP) in September of 2017, the compound has not been found in any water sources used by the City of Tempe following increased monitoring. Initially, ADEQ notified the City in June of 2018 that Tempe did not monitor and report the water source in the fourth quarter of 2017 (Q4/2017) and the first quarter of 2018 (Q1/2018), as required by rule. In response, Tempe initiated an increased sampling frequency and subsequently missed monitoring and reporting. Tempe has no reason to believe the missed monitoring and reporting had an impact on public health. Tempe has taken measures to ensure that all detected compounds are evaluated upon receipt of laboratory results and monitoring and reporting frequencies are updated accordingly.

**Special Information for Immuno-compromised People**  
Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immuno-compromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, who have undergone organ transplants, with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk for infection. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their healthcare providers. EPA/Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available through the Safe Drinking Water Hotline 800-426-4991.

**Lead** - If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Tempe is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in home plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to two minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in your water, you may wish to have your water tested. **Arsenic** - While your drinking water meets EPA's standard for arsenic, it does contain low levels of arsenic. EPA's standard balances the current understanding of arsenic's possible health effects against the costs of removing arsenic from drinking water. EPA continues to research the health effects of low levels of arsenic, which is a mineral known to cause cancer in humans at high concentrations and is linked to other health effects such as skin disease and circulatory problems.

**Nitrate** - Nitrate in drinking water at levels above 10 ppm is a health risk for infants less than six months of age. High nitrate levels in drinking water can cause blue baby syndrome. Nitrate levels may rise quickly for short periods of time because of rainfall or agricultural activity. If you are caring for an infant, you should ask for advice from your healthcare provider.

**Fluoride** - In addition to compliance sampling, fluoride is monitored daily at both Tempe treatment plants and reported to Arizona Department of Health Services monthly for oral health monitoring. The ranges reported in the table above are combined results from the daily treatment plants and system site monitoring.

**Cryptosporidium**  
Cryptosporidium is a microbial pathogen found in surface water throughout the U.S. Ingestion of Cryptosporidium may cause cryptosporidiosis, an abdominal infection. Symptoms of infection include nausea, diarrhea, and abdominal cramps. Most healthy individuals can overcome the disease within a few weeks. However, immunocompromised people, infants and small children, and the elderly are at greater risk of developing life-threatening illness. Although filtration removes Cryptosporidium, the most commonly used filtration methods cannot guarantee 100 percent removal. Our monitoring indicates, although infrequent, these organisms are present in our source water. Current test methods do not allow us to determine if the organisms are dead or if they are capable of causing disease. Based on source water monitoring for Cryptosporidium at Tempe's two water treatment plants between October 2003 and October 2006, Tempe's source water was determined to be low risk under EPA's regulations for cryptosporidium, and no additional measures were required. Recent results collected between 2015-2017 will result in no additional treatment requirements, but will require Tempe to maintain ongoing documentation of effective disinfection practices.

**Source Water Assessment Summary**  
ADEQ completed an assessment of the source waters and drinking water wells for Tempe's public water system in 2014. The assessment reviewed the hydrologic settings in which sources are located and any adjacent land uses that may pose a potential contamination risk to water sources. These potential risks include, but are not limited to, gas stations, landfills, dry cleaners, agricultural fields, wastewater treatment plants, and mining activities. ADEQ categorized sources as either "high risk" or "low risk" to future contamination (either natural or manmade). A designation of high risk indicates there are additional source water protection measures that can be implemented at the local level. A low risk designation indicates that most source water protection measures are either already implemented, and/or the hydrologic setting is such that it is protective of the source water.

ADEQ categorized all surface water sources as high risk because they are open to the atmosphere. The overall risk posed to surface water is addressed by EPA through its increased monitoring requirements for surface water sources.

Most of Tempe's drinking water wells were designated at low risk in the ADEQ 2014 source water assessment. However, two wells were considered at high risk for possible future contamination based upon adjacent land use. The two wells are located within the boundaries of the South Indian Bend Wash Superfund Site in Tempe (SIBW). EPA's first five-year review of the SIBW (September, 2011) suggests that the risk to these wells is decreasing. Tempe continues to regularly conduct monitoring of drinking water from all wells to ensure that nearby land use has not impacted the source water. Regular monitoring provides time for Tempe to sever contaminated sources from Tempe's drinking water infrastructure well in advance of reaching concentrations that posed a public health risk.
