MidFirst Bank launching major expansion in Phoenix metro area

Thile MidFirst may not yet be a household name in Arizona, that's about to change. The bank's new branch, opening this fall on Elliott Road just west of Rural Road in south Tempe, will be one of 12 new MidFirst banking centers opening in metro Phoenix this

Officials of the Oklahoma-based bank say the company plans to double that number next year because they consider the Phoenix area a high-growth market in the near- and long-term.

Mortgage lending is a big part of what MidFirst offers the local housing market, according to Mike Piazza, vice president.

"We offer competitive rates as well as some of the lowest fees on the market on conventional, FHA and VA loans," said Piazza. "We also have special programs for first-time homebuyers as well as combo loans.'

Unlike the giant publicly owned chains in Arizona, MidFirst is the third-largest privately owned bank in the United States, yet remains proud of its small-bank feel and personalized service.

"Our banking staff is very active in the communities we support," he said. Both the south Tempe manager, Lindsay Naughton, and the branch's business relationship manager, Barbara Castle, already have

Incentives driving availability of home mortgages

ood news is in the wind for homebuyers with a recently enacted economic stimulus package starting to produce results in the Kyrene Corridor.

The incentive program increases the limits on FHA loans in Maricopa and Pima counties to \$346,250 from \$236,150, which means that more mortgages can be guaranteed, thus expanding the number of loans available and increasing the number of people able to buy or refinance.

At Hunt Real Estate ERA, Broker **Jeff Lucas** said the increase appears to have bolstered the housing mortgage

market by immediately infusing it with needed liquidity.

The loan limits are intended to be in effect only through the end of the year.

For buyers expecting to be in a home for more than two years, now would seem to be a good time to buy, say the experts. Prices may still move lower this year, they say, but based on statistics compiled by the National Association of Realtors, are expected to go back up before the time comes to sell again.

Said Lucas:

"If you saw a dream home you

couldn't afford last year, look again. Two trends are moving in the buyer's favor – the price may have dropped and you will be able to afford a bigger mortgage at a lower interest rate."

Besides the increase in loan limits, the main advantage of FHA versus a conventional loan is that the credit qualifying criteria for a borrower are not as strict as conventional loan financing, and the down payment requirements for creditworthy buyers are as low as 0 to 3 percent.

"That has opened the floodgates of good buyers who just don't have the cash," said Lucas.

The immediate result of this is that the oversupply of homes under \$350,000 has started to be drawn down.

Widening projects hold promise of reducing accidents Ray, McClintock/Rural earmarked for upgrades

wo major intersection-widening projects are planned for the Kyrene Corridor in coming years and hold the promise of reducing accidents and financial losses. The Ray Road/McClintock Drive intersection is scheduled for widening in 2010-11, followed by the Ray Road/Rural Road intersection in 2012-13.

The projects will mimic similar improvements

performed at intersections along Elliot Road at Dobson and Alma School roads and along Arizona Avenue at Ray Road, Elliot Road and Chandler Boulevard.

Chandler saw an average 27 percent reduction in accidents and 39 percent reduction in injuries following the widening of the five intersections noted above.

In the case of the Arizona Avenue/Elliot intersection, accidents dropped 48 percent, according to city data.

Accident reductions associated with these intersections are calculated to save Chandler residents approximately \$2.3 million annually in direct costs related to auto repair, lost wages and medical costs. This does not include indirect costs such as pain and suffering, reduced quality of life and other benefits.

The \$2.3 million savings figure was derived using the average cost of a property-damage-only accident, an injury accident and a fatal accident.

These numbers come from the National Safety Council and reflect the direct cost of auto repairs, lost wages from hospitalization or time off work to get a car repaired, medical costs for treatment and other expenses.

The NSC information was applied to the number of accidents reduced each year to arrive at the annual savings.







Two area locations announced for information-gathering meetings

Input sought for Kyrene Corridor transit analysis

ETRO is seeking community input on potential routes and transit modes under evaluation in the agency's Tempe South Alternatives Analysis.

The Tempe South project study area is bounded by the Tempe Branch of the Union Pacific Railroad on the west, Loop 101 on the east, Route 202 (Red Mountain Freeway) on the north and Route 202 (Santan Freeway) on the south.

Since the first series of community

meetings held in January, potential routes that provide connection to Tempe, Chandler and the 20-mile light rail starter line, have been further reviewed.

Elements such as potential ridership, costs and environmental impacts continue to be studied in an effort to narrow in on the most cost effective solution to this corridor's travel demand and transportation problems.

Public meetings are important opportunities for area residents and business owners to learn the latest project updates and to provide input that will help guide future study efforts.

Staff will be on-hand to present project updates and answer questions.

The meeting dates and locations are: **Tuesday, June 10**, 6 – 8 p.m., Tempe Public Library, 3500 S. Rural Rd.,


Wednesday, June 11, 6 – 8 p.m., Corona del Sol High School, 1001 E. Knox Road, Tempe.

Two Duanes, junior and senior, head up hoops camp

If your kids are enrolled in the Hoops Star camp this summer at Kiwanis Park, you can expect they'll be learning basketball fundamentals and shooting skills from a pair of coaches who really know the game, namely the two **Sam Duanes**, senior and junior.

Duane Sr. was Corona del Sol High School's first and only basketball coach for almost 20 years. He started when the school opened in 1977, and by the time he retired after the 1996-97 season, he had not only racked up 376 victories but was, at the time, Arizona's all-time leader in basketball wins.

He also took the Aztecs to the state champion finals nine times, bringing home the trophy four times.

During his tenure, the Aztecs had a 46-game winning streak, which no doubt helped officials decide to name the school's gym in Duane Sr.'s honor.

The only other coach to take the Aztecs to a state championship final is son Duane Jr., or Sammie, as he is best known.

Duane Jr. probably spent more time in Corona's gym growing up than any other kid in the area. You might say he developed an interest in coaching basketball while under the scorer's table watching his dad coach before he was old enough to be in high school

He finally got his chance to play Aztec basketball in 1982, graduating in 1986.

"We also played in a very tough region," recalls Duane Jr.

"Only difference is that the region consisted of 12 teams—not four teams like the current Central region. The 12 teams included all the Mesa schools, all the Tempe schools, Gilbert and Chandler."

Only three teams qualified for state, and it was based on the top three finishes in the region tournament, said Duane Jr.

"It was very competitive but very fun. Our region tournament went on for a week, and the gym was packed every night. To just get out of the region and to state was a huge accomplishment."

"McClintock High School was a big rival of Corona during my years as well as Marcos," continued Duane, Jr. "We also didn't have the 3point shot which I would have loved in my day."

Sam Duane, Jr. went on to earn a Bachelors degree in Exercise Science from Grand Canyon University and a Masters Degree in Education Leadership from NAU, at the same time gaining valuable coaching experience.

He coached at Phoenix College and Mesa Community College and was the first head coach at Gilbert's Mesquite High School when it opened in 1008

While building the basketball program at Mesquite, Duane, Jr., was the Fiesta Region coach of the year two times and his 2002 Wildcats were ranked #1 most of the season and finished the season 23-8.

Duane, Jr., switched his dynasty building focus from Mesquite to his alma mater, Corona, in 2003, when the head coaching job became available.

Since Duane came to CdS, the Aztecs have played in the 5A Division I state tournament every year capturing the runner-up banner in 2006. He was also named Arizona Coaches Association Coach of the year in 2006.

Duane's overall record at Corona is 92-52. The Aztecs were in the Central region championship game three straight years, Sam Duane, Jr., was not the only kid to get the coaching bug from legendary basketball coach, Sam Duane, Sr.

Doug Harris, Desert Vista's 2008 state championship basketball coach, played for Duane Sr. at Corona. When he was a junior, the Aztecs won the 1989 championship, beating Glendale Apollo, 88-85. During his senior year, they were runner ups to Scottsdale Saguaro in the 1990 championship game.

"Two other guys I played with are now head coaches," said Duane.

"Brian Fleming at Mountain Pointe and Scooter Molander, who just won the 2007 state football championship at Brophy, played with me at Corona."

Together, the father son duo bring close to 40 years of basketball coaching experience to young boys and girls who want to learn or improve their basketball skills in one of several sports camps offered through the City of Tempe every summer.

The Hoop Star basketball camps are available during three sessions: June 9-12, June 16-19, and June 23-26.

A shooting camp will be given July 7-10 and an offensive camp July 14-17. To register for any of these classes or get more information, go to http://www.tempe.gov/kiwanis/SportsCamps/basketball.htm.

Escape to Alcatraz: Swimmers challenge icy SF bay

It takes about 15 minutes to travel from San Francisco to Alcatraz Island on a boat; Corona's Amy Foster and Katie Chen decided to forgo the boat and swim the distance.

"We swam from the island to the shore last year,' Foster said. "But it wasn't that long, so we wanted a bigger and better challenge."

The two girls, who have both swum competitively for many years, planned to be swimming with one other person and viewed it as a fun and challenging adventure.

"About three years ago, my club coach got me into open water swimming," Chen said. "It is so really different, and I enjoy it more than just swimming in a pool."

The journey represents a total of 3.5 miles and was due to take them once around Alcatraz Island and back to San Francisco. "It is long, but I've been swimming since I was five," Foster said. "It is really

not as far as it seems."

The group found a driver for their boat who planned to follow them during the trip.

He also determined when the tides would be safest, and the girls wore wetsuits to help stay warm during their swim, which they completed mid-day May 28.

"The first time I was worried about the temperature and the ocean," Chen said. "I wasn't able to enjoy the view. This time was designed to be different, she says. "I understand the other factors and just want to enjoy it."

Foster says she hopes she can do some sort of Alcatraz swim every year.

Historically, people believed that the waters between Alcatraz Island and San Francisco would stop anyone from being able to escape.

However, as history has suggested, and as Chen and Foster have shown, this is not the case. "Having known what I did and overcoming all the factors, I will have a feeling of accomplishment," Chen said.

Sportsplex site of Diamondbacks' summer training session for kids

Snedigar Sportsplex will be the site of a five-day youth baseball and softball camp being sponsored by the Arizona Diamondbacks Training Centers.

The program runs from 8 to 11 a.m. June 16 through 20. Registration for kids 6-12 years of age is now being accepted. Fee of \$150 includes 15 hours of instruction, hat, T-shirt and an instructional DVD.

Cinema ties B&W fair to annual film-noir event

ere's a shameful confession from someone who has spent about 30 years as a movie critic: I've never much liked film festivals.

They almost always involve sifting through hours of well-intentioned incompetence or banality for a few small glimmers of promise, and these bright spots are sometimes such a contrast to the general dreariness that they end up being overrated.

Normally, if you see one truly firstrate effort at a festival of new work, you can count yourself lucky. I felt lucky indeed at this year's Phoenix Film Festival—the only picture to which I made it, Thomas McCarthy's *The Visitor*, remains the best film I've seen so far this year.

So, like I said, all these years I've regarded festival-going as more of a professional duty than a pleasure.

But about this time last year, The Wife and I spent a couple of days in California's

uncannily beautiful Coachella Valley on another matter and, quite by accident, stumbled upon a film festival for people who don't like film festivals: The Palm Springs Film Noir Festival.

So it was on our schedule again this year, the weekend of May 31-June 1.

Now in its eighth year, the fest was organized by novelist and nonfiction writer Arthur Lyons, and it focuses mainly on genuinely obscure vintage stuff—of the 13 scheduled films this year, two are from the '60s; the rest are from the '40s or '50s.

Cool character players ranging from Angie Dickinson to Carol Lynley to Billy Gray are scheduled to attend as guests at screenings of the films they're in.

Last year I saw what Lyons and his cronies introduced as possibly the only prints in existence of such wonderful Hollywood rarities as *No Questions Asked* and *Port of Forty Thieves*, screened at the Camelot Theatre on Baristo Road in Palm Springs.

Sadly, festival founder Lyons passed on earlier this year.

But this weekend's schedule of films is reportedly his work, and it includes such cool hardboiled crime thrillers as the 1947 *Dead Reckoning*, with Humphrey Bogart and Lizabeth Scott, and 1964s *The Killers*, with Ronald Reagan as a gangster (!) in his last movie part, as well as forgotten B-curios like *Treasure of Monte Cristo* (1949) and *Without Warning* (1952).

If, like me, you can't resist black-andwhite movies shown on a screen, you could do worse than a Palm Springs road trip this weekend.

If that's not feasible, however, you can get your black-and-white movie fix within just a few minutes' drive, with Repertory Film at Chandler Cinema, 2140 N. Arizona Ave This week's program is a triple feature—not a double feature, a *triple* feature of Roger Corman movies for the low price of six bucks, showing at 8 p.m. Friday, May 30, and at 5 and 9 p.m. Saturday, May 31.

Leading off is the sidesplitting 1957 B-epic *The Saga of the Viking Women and Their Voyage to the Waters of the Great Sea Serpent*—at 66 minutes, the film isn't as long as the title.

It's followed by 1958's War of the Satellites, a Cold War-era thriller that Corman is said to have rushed into theaters in just two months to capitalize on the hysteria over Sputnik.

Rounding out the triple-header is Corman's 1957 rock-n'-roll melodrama Rock All Night.

Her previous titles include Junior Teen Queen at the Apache Junction Rodeo and 2006 Gilbert Days Rodeo Missy.


As Rodeo Princess, she travels the state attending rodeos with her horse, rides in major parades and participates in community-service activities.

She is a straight-A student at KMS, treasurer for her 4-H Club and a member of the National Charity League, a mother-daughter philanthropic organization.



Corona del Sol graduate Joshua Hardenbrook has been named a National Hispanic Scholar by the College Board's National Hispanic Recognition Program, NHRP.


Hardenbrook was one of the eight valedictorians in Corona's graduating class of 2008.

U.S. authority on racism in classroom to address Kyrene educators at workshop

Tyrene district staff members will go through an intense, three-day training being provided by a noted U.S. authority on the role of race in the classroom.

Dr. Beverly Daniel Tatum, a clinical psychologist who currently serves as president of Spellman College and is an expert in the psychology of racism, will meet with local educators June 2-4.

Her areas of interest include Black families in White communities, racial identity and the role of race in the classroom. Before assuming the college presidency in 2002, Tatum was a professor of psychology, dean and acting president at Mount Holyoke College.

Tatum is said to believe in straight talk about race, particularly in the classroom. She is the author of the book "Why Are All the Black Kids Sitting Together in the Cafeteria? and Other Conversations about Race."

Tatum focuses on racial identity in teens and the role of race in the classroom. She has written more than 17 articles and book chapters, most of which address topics of race.

She holds a B.A. in psychology from Wesleyan University and a M.A.

and Ph.D. in clinical psychology from the University of Michigan, as well as a M.A. in Religious Studies from the Hartford Seminar.

Tatum's meeting the local school staff is designed help teachers:

- Understand how to motivate all students, even those typically left out.
- Learn how to implement the Equity Framework, enabling you to close the achievement and eliminate it permanently.
- See how to create an inclusive and safe environment for both teachers and students.
- Examine multiple classrooms, schools, and districts where the achievement gap has been successfully eliminated.

In her book, Tatum applies her expertise on race to argue that straight talk about racial identity is essential to the nation.

Using real-life examples and the latest research, she dispels race as taboo and provides a new lens for understanding the emergence of racial identity as a developmental process experienced by everyone.



um-chewing is just one of the diversions soldiers use to keep their minds off the stresses of battle. But when that small, jawbending perk is hard to come by, it can be missed.

That was what prompted the kids at Kyrene de las Manitas Elementary School to donate 15,000 packs of gum to Packages from Home.

On May 21, with radio station KEZ-FM broadcasting live from the school, the students made their presentation to Army Sgt. Pat Zeigert, who thanked the kids and let them know how much their efforts would mean to soldiers in the field.

Zeigert has served in both the Navy and Army,

most recently in Baghdad.

The drive began after **Kathy Wagoner**, a fourth grade teacher at Manitas, heard a KEZ announcer read a letter from a soldier named Justin mentioning that his fellow soldiers weren't able to get an adequate supply of chewing gum.

Within a matter of days, Wagoner's students had donated 1,000 packs of the sticky stuff, but couldn't handle all the work involved in getting it ready for shipment. Mrs. Lily's third grade class then joined the project to help with logistics and postage.

The radio station's Marty Manning and Packages from Home staffer Lisa Benson were able to work out the details and ensure the gum will go to the troops, including, naturally, Justin's unit.



School redistricting plan to be reviewed at June 10 meeting

Kyrene Corridor residents have been invited to participate in a schoolredistricting forum scheduled for 6:30 p.m. Tuesday,

June 10, at Phoenix College.

The meeting will be hosted by the School District Redistricting Commission to review plans that will be on the ballot to create six new unified school districts in Maricopa County.

The plans will affect students at 34 of the county's non-unified school districts, including Kyrene, Tempe Union and Tempe Elementary.

At the forum, voters will learn the details of the plan, gain background information on each of the affected districts, and be able to ask questions of the commissioners involved in the unification

Additional forums for Maricopa County addressing the East and West Valley may also be planned for late summer.

Qualified Maricopa County voters in the 34 affected school districts will have the opportunity to approve or reject the redistricting plan by voting on a set of ballot questions during the November

elections.

If approved, the districts will be unified for the beginning of the 2010 school year.

The commission studying the matter was created by the Arizona Legislature in 2005 and charged with making recommendations for creating unified school districts out of 108 common districts and 15 union districts.

A unified district is one that is geographically defined and offers aligned curriculum for students Kindergarten through grade 12.

The commission formally presented its recommendations to Gov. Janet Napolitano in December 2007.





started making their presence known in the area. Most recently, says Piazza, MidFirst's fundraising van participated in three events in

Tempe, including the Arizona Cardinals Fan Fest at the team's practice facility at Warner and Hardy, generating support for Cardinals charities.

It also showed up at the Costco store at Elliott and Hardy in support of the Children's Miracle Network and at the Fiddlesticks on Elliot, raising funds for local Rotary clubs.

The same availability can be extended to residents of the Kyrene Corridor who are looking for fundraising opportunities, according to Piazza.

"Our 30-foot-long van is complete with two coin-counting machines and an ATM, which we bring to local schools and events to assist organizations with their fundraising efforts," says Piazza.

Among MidFirst's more unusual services are free coin-counting machines in the bank lobby for anyone (customer or not), free use of automatic teller machines for customers nationwide and the longest banking hours in the Valley: 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday, 9 to 2 on Saturdays, 10 to 2 on Sundays.

If you're not counting coins but are potentially interested in a banking career, MidFirst is currently hiring tellers and customer-care coordinators.

In addition to the launch of the branch at Rural and Elliot later this year, MidFirst will open another banking center at 48th Street and Chandler Boulevard later this year and yet another at Priest and Warner in 2009.

Most surprisingly, while the banking and mortgage industry as a whole has experienced uncertainty and a precipitous drop in profitability in the last year, MidFirst reported \$68.2 million in earnings for the first quarter this year, compared with \$52 million for the first quarter last year.

"MidFirst remains a top performer in the banking industry," said **Jeff Lowe**, president of MidFirst Bank's Arizona operations.

"As measured by return on equity, MidFirst ranks among the top two percent of all banks in the United States," he said.

Clearly MidFirst is optimistic about the future and hoping Valley residents will share its vision.


